Half Marathon Fundraiser for Charlton Playing Fields

On Saturday 26th November, Charlton's Ali Collis is joining the Aynho Running Group to run a half marathon to raise funds for the Charlton Playing Field Project.

Nature Notes

At the time of writing we are still having warm autumn days with blue skies, sunshine, and what little rain we have had has almost all fallen during the nights. Our puppy has hardly met any rain during her short life. The colours of the autumn leaves are already glorious and there is still much to come. Most leaves are green throughout the summer and this is due to the presence of chlorophyll, the green pigment which enables the leaves to carry out their important function of photosynthesising – transmuting the energy of the sunshine into food for the plant. (That's a very basic explanation.)

Autumn leaf colour comes from two groups of pigments: carotenoids, the orange-yellow colours which are present in leaves through the year, and anthocynanins which produce the reds and purples in autumn leaves. The carotenoids are masked most of the year by the green chlorophyll, but as this dwindles with the shortening days, the yellow, orange and brown pigments show through. We love seeing the field maples turn: these are our only native members of the acer family, and their leaves become a gorgeous rich butter yellow – there are some lovely ones in the hedge to the right of the lane going down the hill to Kings Sutton. Native silver birch also tends to turn a good yellow.

The anthocyanins are not present in the leaves throughout the year, but are actively produced in late summer, developing in the sap of the cells in the leaves. This is the result of many factors both inside and outside the plant, but roughly speaking the formation of these pigments depends on the breakdown of sugars in the presence of bright light. And of course, this last summer and autumn there has been a lot of sunshine, enabling both the production of sugars and then their breakdown. We noticed some elders in the hedges which have turned a delicate pinky-green, and the dogwood leaves are developing rich purple tints. Other native shrubs and trees which develop rich colours in this spectrum are spindles, some of the blackthorns, hawthorns, guelder rose (not a rose but a viburnum with clusters of brilliant translucent red berries), rowan and dogwoods.

Many trees had a false autumn where they dropped many of their leaves during the heatwave and the drought, as a protective mechanism. At the same time, reacting to the stress they were under, many put all their efforts into producing more seeds as possibly their last chance for producing progeny. Oak trees are laden with acorns (oak trees do not produce acorns every year), there are masses of conkers and hawthorns are laden with berries – but very few sloes as these must have been blighted by a late frost in the spring.

We haven't had much to report about bird life recently, apart from our sadness at having no swifts nesting in our eaves. Climate change brings all sorts of surprises, and we were told of the appearance of a little white egret by the lake at the bottom of the village. This is a small white member of the heron family which first appeared in the UK in significant numbers in 1989 and was first recorded as breeding in Dorset in 1996. It is now thought to be established in many breeding sites along the south coast, and is obviously trying out the possibilities of inland counties as well.



Newbottle & Charlton School Update





Notes of the Newbottle Parish Council Meeting Wednesday 19 October 2022 at the Memorial Hall, Charlton www.newbottleparishcouncil.co.uk

Present – Parish Councillors Michael Loggin (Chairman), Struan Kenton and Wayne Rule and Theresa Goss (Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer).

Vacancy – Following a resignation, there is a vacancy on the Parish Council. If anyone is interested in joining, please contact the Clerk. newbottleparishcoun-cil@yahoo.co.uk or 01295 710965.

Playing Field and Pavilion – The Parish Council confirmed its appointment of a Sub-Committee, the Playing Fields Association (PFA), to manage the playing field on its behalf. There would be discussions between the Parish Council and the PFA on its Terms of Reference. The Parish Council thanked the PFA for all its work at the playing field.

Community Bus Service – A community bus service was being run from the village to Brackley, Northampton, Banbury and Towcester. For more information, please call 'Ability' on 01327 604123.

Flagpole – Investigations would be made into a flagpole for the village and it would be discussed further at the next meeting.

Street Lighting – Discussions were ongoing with Eon with regard to the roll out of the new street lights and it was hoped the project would commence shortly.

If any street lights are not working, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council with the lamp number/location and this information will be forwarded to Eon. Please bear in mind that the street lighting contract is between the Parish Council and Eon, so if residents contact Eon directly, they may not get a response.

Fly Tipping – If residents are aware of any fly tipping, please report this to West Northamptonshire Council. https://www.southnorthants.gov.uk/report or call 0300 126 7000. They will collect the rubbish and also gather evidence, which will then help them prosecute the offenders.

Poors Allotment Committee – Councillor Linda Baker would provide the Parish Council with an update on the Committee at the next meeting.

HM The Queen, Book of Condolence – Father Matthew had kindly agreed that the Book could be kept at the Church and it would be available for viewing on special occasions. Due to the number of Books which had been opened, the County Archives were unable to store them.

Parking Issues – The Parish Council kindly requests that drivers do not park their vehicles on the footpaths in the village. Parking on footpaths means that pedestrians and especially those with pushchairs or wheelchairs have to move into the road to get past the vehicle. This is clearly very dangerous and residents should not be putting other residents in this dangerous position, especially when everyone is so aware of the speeding issues through the village. **Please park considerately in the village.**


